

Rubie Park

History

Rubie Park was built in conjunction with the Rubie residential subdivision.

Rubie Park was significantly upgraded in 2007 with excavation and then reconstruction of the irrigation system, landscaping with reseeded grass, as well as removal of some equipment including the merry-go-round, a small slide, and a rocker. The Village-appointed Environment Recreation and Parks Committee was involved in organizing volunteers and fundraising for the new playground equipment; which included a large Double BIGGO swing, 2 spinner bowls, a concrete climbing wall, and powder coated metal with recycled plastic picnic tables. Funding was provided by Alberta Community Facility Enhancement Program grant, Albert Sport Recreation Parks & Wildlife Foundation, Trans Canada, County of Lethbridge, Village of Nobleford and Private donations. The original galvanized post swing set, wide slide, metal benches and garbage receptacles were rebuilt and remain in place.

In 2012/13, the wood borders around the playground equipment were replaced with modern plastic borders and additional pea gravel was added, as well as the removal of paving stones and replacement with a concrete picnic table slab.
